The Ups and Downs of Holy Week

“The last week has been a roller coaster ride!” Perhaps you have heard someone describe life in those terms. We understand the expression – life has its share of twists and turns, of highs and lows. We understand because we have been (or can at least imagine being!) on a roller coaster.

It starts slow – a crawl up the first hill to the highest point – and then the fun begins! Speeding through banked turns and flying up and down hills – there is that combination of thrill and terror all rolled into one.

“Roller Coaster” seems to be a fitting description of the events of Holy Week. The week begins with the high of Palm Sunday, where Jesus is proclaimed King as the people shout “Hosanna!” Next, we witness the lows – betrayal, abandonment, flogging, trials, crucifixion.
